	HILIPPA JILLIAN SPENCE, Director of Aviation Safety, on behalf of CASA, make this instrument er regulations 11.056, 11.160, 11.205 and 61.040 of the <i>Civil Aviation Safety Regulations 1998.</i>	Section 1 also outlines that the power to make the instrument is drawn from regulation 11.160 of CASR, which provides that CASA may grant an exemption from compliance with a provision of CAR or CASR.

1	Name This instrument is CASA EX64/22 — Flight Training and Flight Tests by Grade 1 Training Endorsement Holders (Exemptions and Approvals) Instrument 2022.	Regulation 11.056 empowers CASA to impose conditions on authorisations, including authorisations granted under regulation 61.040.
2	Duration This instrument:  (a) commences on 1 September 2022; and  (b) is repealed at the end of 31 August 2025.	Section 2 provides for the duration of the instrument. The maximum period of applicability of an exemption instrument is 3 years: see regulation 11.230 of CASR. These dates will be amended to reflect the actual commencement date to ensure a validity period of 3 years.

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## 3 Interpretation

(1) In this instrument, unless the contrary intention appears:

**Flight examiner rating course** means the course of that name, prepared by CASA, as existing from time to time.

*Part 141 operator* has the meaning given by subregulation 141.015 (3) of CASR. *table 61.1235* means the table in regulation 61.1235 of CASR.

	The instructor proficiency check requirement is intended to ensure G1 holders who utilise the expanded privileges continue to have regular competency checks conducted by an examiner.

  - (ii) paragraphs 61.1280 (2) (e) and (3) (d);
  - (iii) regulation 61.1295;
  - (iv) subregulations 61.1300 (4) and (5);
- (d) the flight instructor must not:
  - (i) assess a person's competency for the grant of the authorisation; or
  - (ii) complete administrative matters associated with that grant,

unless the flight instructor has obtained the prior approval of CASA to do so, following the successful completion by the flight instructor of such e-learning modules of the Flight examiner rating course as CASA considers appropriate.
